ORDINANCE NO. 2174

“AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 375 “VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC” “RESIDENT PARKING PROGRAM” TO REQUIRE RESIDENT PARKING PERMITS”

WHEREAS, many residents have expressed a concern over the number of vehicles that are parked on Borough streets that do not belong to Borough residents; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Governing Body to eliminate this practice by providing for Resident-Only Parking during certain reasonable hours; and

WHEREAS, the enforcement of this new program shall begin after the residents have been provided with adequate notice through either a mailing or a posting of appropriate signs in order to allow residents enough time to obtain the require permit;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ridgefield, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, being the governing body thereof, that Chapter 375 “Vehicles and Traffic” “Resident Parking Program” to require resident parking permits

§ 375-61. Resident parking program.

A. No person shall park a vehicle upon any of the streets within the Borough of Ridgefield during the applicable days and hours of restrictions set forth herein unless a resident displays a valid residential parking permit:

(1) On any Borough street between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., Monday through Sunday.

B. All alternate side of the street parking ordinances, either currently or subsequently adopted by the Borough, shall remain in full force and effect.

C. This article shall be enforced by the Police Department of the Borough of Ridgefield.

D. Rules and regulations. The following rules and regulations shall apply to the Borough of Ridgefield resident permit parking program:

(1) A resident parking permit of a design specified by the Chief of the Police Department of the Borough of Ridgefield (the Police Department) will be issued to the resident owner of a vehicle. The vehicle must be owned by a person residing in the Borough of Ridgefield.

(2) Proof of residency of the owner of a vehicle must be presented when applying for a permit. The following is acceptable proof of residency and one from each subsection must be provided:

(a) A copy of a valid New Jersey driver's license reflecting his/her address in the Borough of Ridgefield; and

(b) A copy of a valid New Jersey motor vehicle registration for the vehicle for which the permit is sought, showing his/her address in the Borough of Ridgefield along with a valid insurance policy showing all vehicles listed on the policy to that address or insurance card. In the case of a vehicle claimed to be leased and used by a Ridgefield resident, a copy of a valid motor vehicle registration and a copy of the automobile lease shall be presented to the Borough Clerks Office in lieu of the New Jersey motor vehicle registration.

(c) A current PSE&G bill, United Water bill, or lease agreement. If the last name of the individual is different than that on the current PSE&G bill, United Water bill, or lease agreement provide copy of birth certificate showing name listed on above.

(3) The resident's sticker is to be placed on the driver's side back of rear view mirror of the registered vehicle.

(4) The Borough Clerks Office shall have the authority to issue temporary resident permit parking stickers to persons claiming to be residents of the Borough but who have not yet changed their license or their motor vehicle registration to reflect the Ridgefield address and to any resident holding a current resident permit but whose car has been stolen or incapacitated and who is driving a temporary vehicle. The temporary sticker shall be valid for a period not to exceed 30 days, at which time the resident must obtain a permanent sticker by presentation of the proofs of residency set forth in Subsection D(2) above, in the case of new residents, and the temporary permit shall expire in the case of a temporary vehicle. Temporary permit parking stickers will also be issued to healthcare workers required to render in-home care for a Ridgefield resident. Doctor's note ordering care must accompany the request for a temporary permit. Said permit must be renewed monthly at no cost.

(5) Contractors', service and delivery vehicles bearing the name and address of a commercial business may park without a permit during the time they are rendering service to a residence within the permit parking area.

(6) Emergency vehicles and public service, telephone and other public utility vehicles may park within the permit parking area during the time they are rendering service or repairs within the area.

(7) The Board of Education shall request an appropriate number of business permits to be distributed by the Board of Education to employees of Ridgefield schools who may be required to park on Borough streets prior to 9:00 a.m.

§ 375-62. Visitor permits.

One (1) visitor permit will be issued per household at the annual cost of \$10.00 which can be obtained at the time of resident registration.

§ 375-63. Business permits.

A. Business establishments located in the Borough of Ridgefield may obtain business permits for any nonresidential employee of such business establishment who commutes to work by automobile in accordance with the provisions of this section. Ridgefield business establishments shall be deemed to include the Borough of Ridgefield and the Board of Education of the Borough of Ridgefield. Said permits to be valid only during normal business hours. In order to obtain such permits, the business establishments must present a letter to the Borough Clerks Office verifying that there is no adequate off-street parking to the employee. The letter shall list the name of the employee, the vehicle identification number and license plate of the vehicle, the driver's license number, the employer and such other information as may be required by the Borough Clerks Office.

B. All written requests for business permits shall be executed by a responsible officer of the employer (or the Chief in the case of the Borough of Ridgefield or the Superintendent in the case of the Ridgefield Board of Education). The Borough Clerks Office shall be entitled to obtain periodic verification of all relevant information and shall have the power to invalidate or not renew any business permit issued pursuant to this section if the information indicates non-entitlement to the business permit or requested information to verify entitlement is not furnished.

C. These permits shall be issued in the discretion of the Borough Clerks Office.

§ 375-64. Deleted in it's entirety.

§ 375-65. Fees.

Resident parking permit fee is \$5.00 per permit. Businesses shall be charged \$10.00 per year for each business permit issued, payable upon issuance of the permit, except the Borough and Board of Education. Visitor parking permit fee is \$10.00 per year; limited to one (1) permit per household. Replacement parking permit fee is \$100.00 and must be accompanied by a police report for the lost or stolen parking permit.

§ 375-66. Terms of permits.

Resident permits expire 3 years from the date of issuance and must be renewed prior to the expiration date. Ridgefield Board of Education and business permits must be renewed annually.

§ 375-67. Violations and penalties.

A. Any vehicle parked without a valid resident permit or business permit shall be subject to a parking fine of \$28.00 for each part of a twenty-four-hour period that said vehicle is parked in violation of this article. Persons in possession of residential or business permits who misuse them are subject to revocation of the permit for up to one year and a fine of \$100.00. Any vehicle parked with a counterfeit permit shall be subject to a fine of \$250.00. Any vehicle parked with an expired permit shall be subject to a fine of \$28.00.

B. Any vehicle parked in violation of this Article after 72 hours shall be towed at the owner's expense.

§ 375-68. Further rules and regulations.

The Police Department may formulate and recommend rules and regulations pertaining to this article to the Mayor and Council as it deems necessary and proper. The Police Department shall have the power to issue summonses for violation of the article.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Ridgefield previously authorized the advertising for bids to operate the Borough's swimming pool/snack stand concession services for pool seasons 2011 and 2012; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Clerk did receive and open sealed bids on May 6, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Attorney reviewed the two bids submitted and thereafter recommended that the Borough reject both bids; and

WHEREAS, there is a necessity for the Borough to have its swimming pool concession/snack stand operate as of the Memorial Day weekend, which is the date of the pool opening; and

WHEREAS, the amount of the bid (the amount to be paid by the contractor to the Borough for the license to operate the swimming pool concession) is anticipated to be significantly below the bid threshold; and

WHEREAS, the Borough is therefore not required to advertise for bids before awarding the contract; and

WHEREAS, the Borough wishes to authorize Erik Lenander, its certified purchasing agent, to solicit quotations from the unsuccessful bidders and, based on those quotations, to award a contract for 2011 and 2012;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ridgefield as follows:

1. The Mayor and Council hereby rejects all submitted bids for the license to operate the Borough's swimming pool concession stand and facility for pool seasons 2011 and 2012 based on the recommendation of the Borough Attorney.

2. The Borough authorizes purchasing agent Erik Lenander to solicit quotes from the two unsuccessful bidders and on the basis of those quotes, to make a recommendation for the award of a contract for years 2011 and 2012.

3. The Mayor and Council does hereby determine in advance that the contract shall be awarded based on the purchasing agent's recommendation, and that the Borough Attorney be
