WHEREAS, this year, *National Poison Prevention Week*, commissioned by the National Poison Prevention Week Council, will be observed during the week of March 19 - 25, 2017 in an effort to raise awareness and prevent unintentional poison exposure in and around the home; and

WHEREAS, according to the American Association of Poison Control Centers, 2.8 million calls were received in 2015 from consumers for poison exposure treatment or information due to unintentional poisonings that occurred in the home from the kitchen to the laundry room to the garage; and

WHEREAS, during this week, we come together as a community to educate ourselves on poison prevention and pledge our commitment to ensuring the safety of our families, communities, and each other by preventing unintentional poisonings by placing household chemicals out of children's reach, storing items in their original containers to avoid confusion, and taking precautions to understand medication dosages and safety especially in children and older adults; and

WHEREAS, to learn more about ways to keep people of all ages safe and help prevent poisoning, I encourage Ridgefield citizens to visit the Poison Prevention web site at www.poisonprevention.org and to call the New Jersey Poison Control Center in case of an emergency at 1-800-222-1222; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Health and Human Services, the American Association of Poison Control Centers, the National Poison Prevention Week Council, and the Borough of Ridgefield welcome your participation in National Poison Prevention Week; and

WHEREAS, the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c.102, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grant may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent and the spirit of Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act to use the tonnage grants to develop new municipal recycling programs and to continue to expand existing programs; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has promulgated recycling regulations to implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and

WHEREAS, the recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and

WHEREAS, a resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for such tonnage grants for the calendar year 2016 will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and to indicate the assent of the Mayor and Council to the efforts undertaken by the municipality and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and

WHEREAS, such a resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure the application is properly completed and timely filed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ridgefield that the Borough of Ridgefield hereby endorses the submission of the recycling tonnage grant application to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and designates Mildred Rojas to ensure that the application is properly filed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the monies received from the recycling tonnage grant be deposited in a dedicated recycling trust fund to be used solely for the purposes of recycling.

WHEREAS, the Recycling Enhancement Act, P.L. 2007, Chapter 311, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grants may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs; and

WHEREAS, there is levied upon the owner or operator of every solid waste facility (with certain exceptions) a recycling tax of \$3.00 per ton on all solid waste accepted for disposal or transfer at the solid waste facility; and

WHEREAS, whenever a municipality operates a municipal service system for solid waste collection or provides for regular solid waste collection service under a contract awarded pursuant to the "Local Public Contracts Law", the amount of grant monies received by the municipality shall not be less than the annual amount of recycling tax paid by the municipality except that all grant monies received by the municipality shall be expended only for its recycling program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ridgefield that the Borough of Ridgefield hereby certifies a submission of expenditure for taxes paid pursuant to P.L.2007, Chapter 311, in 2016 in the amount of \$12,374.70. Documentation supporting this submission is available at 604 Broad Avenue and shall be maintained for no less than five years from this date.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-20 provides authorization for an emergency temporary appropriation after the first thirty days of the calendar year before adoption of the CY 2017 municipal budget; and
